

I hope you are ready for another adventure. If you haven't done a mystery quilt before, you're in for a treat. If you participated in our last mystery adventure, you already know how sweet the treat is!

Here's how the mystery quilt works. The fabric requirements and cutting instructions are given the first week. Construction steps are posted in the following weeks—just enough to keep you guessing! On the last week, we will give you the final construction steps and reveal the mystery.

Dig through your stash for scraps or yardage in assorted light, medium and dark values as instructed in Fabric Requirements. Remember that mystery-quilt patterns emerge best when high-contrast fabric choices in color and/or value are made. Gather the total yardages listed.

Now get ready to have some fun!

Scrap Buster #7 WEEK 1

FINISHED QUILT SIZE

70" x 86"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

For Piecing:

- Assorted light scraps
- Assorted dark scraps
- 1½ yards medium coordinating tonal

You Will Also Need:

- Template plastic or cardboard
- Thread
- Basic sewing tools and supplies

For Finishing:

Note: We suggest purchasing these yardages after completing the piecing.

- Backing to size
- Batting to size

CUTTING

From assorted light scraps:

- Set aside 80 scraps at least 5" x 6" for cutting A pieces.
- Cut 120 (4⅞") squares.
Subcut squares on 1 diagonal to make 240 D triangles.
- Cut 20 (5¼") squares.
Subcut squares on both diagonals to make 80 E triangles.

From assorted dark scraps:

- Set aside 80 scraps at least 3" x 6" for cutting B pieces.
- Cut 120 (4⅞") squares.
Subcut squares on 1 diagonal to make 240 C triangles.
- Cut 20 (5¼") squares.
Subcut squares on both diagonals to make 80 F triangles.

From coordinating dark:

- Cut 8 (3½" x 40") G/H strips.
